


EQUALITY SCENARIO CARDS

EXAMPLE SCENARIOS

- Cut out and hand out the equality scenario cards. Ensure there is one per group. (Some groups may have the same card.)
- Each group is tasked with reading the equality card and answering the following:
 - What is the inequality in this scenario?
 - What impact does this have?
 - How can this be changed, to ensure equality?
 - How will equality benefit this situation?
- Young people are to discuss this in their groups.
- Gather the groups together and review the equality cards – ensuring the questions are answered.

His mother took him to an after-school dance class, but when he got there it was all girls and the instructor was a little uncertain about him joining. The girls just giggled. So, Jack and his Mum left.

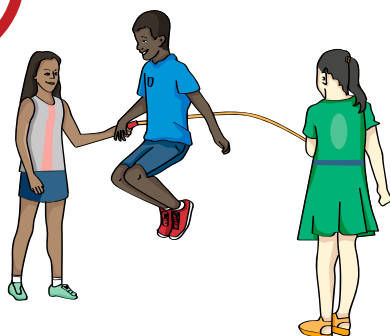

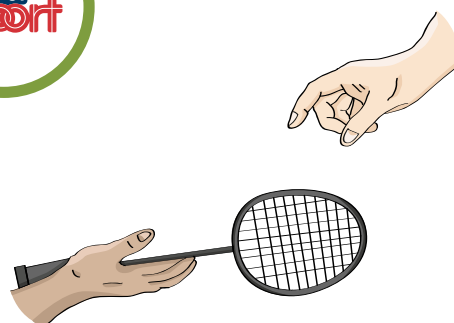
